The majority of residents who posted on Mr O'Connor's official Facebook page agreed with the changes but were concerned about hospital parking.

"I park my car near Parkwood East station while I get treatment at the hospital every four weeks," a resident wrote. "Got one fine because I was 25 minutes too late. I am too sick to walk home after treatment hence (I drive) the car."

Another resident remarked that "the council know its constantly payday for them there because people have no choice out to park on the streets and talk to work".

Mr O'Connor said signage had been removed in Parkwood but a lot remained at radar.

Hospital parking is expensive but the solution is not people to clog up local streets," he told the Bulletin.

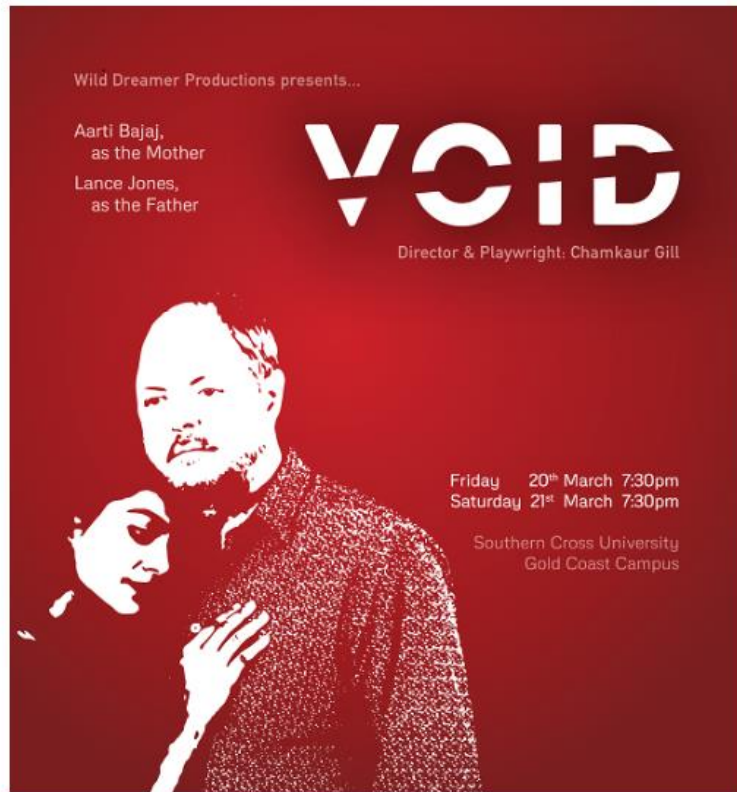
